Subjects explored include women's history, Victorian morals and fashions, industrialization, labor reform, immigration, and prejudice and class. This program will resonate with Foxboro and many local towns whose economy relied on mill and cottage industries that employed women affording them the opportunity to become a "social, political and economic force" in their communities. 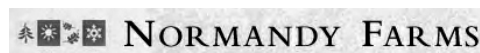
